Who will Control Congress?

A Faculty Club panel of Berkeley's leading political analysts will preview the mid-term congressional elections and discuss the potential for a major political shift that could leave both houses of Congress in the hands of the Republican Party.

The panelist will include:

Jack Citrin - Heller Professor of Political Science and Director of the Institute of Governmental Studies. His research interests include political trust, the foundations of policy preferences, direct democracy, identity, and ethnic politics and immigration and language politics.

Eric Schickler - Chair of the Department of Political Science. He has written or co-authored three books on Congress, partisan politics, and the Senate. His research interests include Congress and political parties, American political development, and public opinion.

Gabriel Lenz - Associate Professor of Political Science. Professor Lenz draws on insights from social psychology and economics to pursue his research and teaching interests in the areas of elections, public opinion, and political psychology voters' ability to control their elected officials and hold politicians accountable.
