## Election panel –The 2012 Presidential Race, part 2

On **Thursday, May 3<sup>rd</sup>**, join Club members and the UC Berkeley Retirement Center at this second panel on the upcoming election. Three deeply informed researchers tackle the origins and evolution of the economic and political angst that seems to afflict the nation. Brad DeLong, Professor of Economics and a research associate of the National Bureau of Economic Research, has both governmental and academic experience in the intersection of economics and politics, including financial crises of the 20<sup>th</sup> century. David Hollinger, the Preston Hotchkis Professor of American History, looks at the loss of respect for academic professionalism and the role of religion in politics. Paul Pierson, the John Gross Professor of Political Science, has discussed publicly the role of politics in the growing inequality between the rich and the middle class. There will be a wine & cheese reception in the Great Hall at 4:30 and the panel will go from 5-6:30. Cost for reception: \$10 for members; \$15 for others. Please reserve at extension 2-224.
